

## Signs of Life

Assurance of salvation in the Bible rests on three things:

1. The trustworthiness of God – who promises to save forever those who sincerely repent & trust in Jesus Christ (Isaiah 55:7; John 3:16)
2. The internal testimony or assurance of the Holy Spirit that we are truly children of God (Romans 8:15-16)
3. The external evidence of the new birth - which unfailingly & inevitably produces the following life changes in those who have been truly saved:
  - A growing sensitivity to the evil & destructiveness of *my* sin (I John 1:8-10)
  - An increasing obedience to the moral will of God = Christlikeness in our behavior (I John 2:3-4)
  - A deepening sense of affinity & affection for fellow believers (I John 2:9-10, 3:14)
  - An intensifying hunger for & responsiveness to the Word of God (I John 4:6, 5:20)
  - An increasing sense of resistance to & a distaste for sin (I John 3:9-10)
  - A growing interest in and desire for personal prayer (I John 5:14-15)
  - An inner agreement with & desire to live out God's will & commands (I John 5:3-4)

An *absence* of these evidences should drive us back to the Lord in sincere trust, surrender, & earnest prayer for His salvation

## Signs of Life
